We hope and pray that you are well during these uncertain times. After two years of being physically apart from our students, it is so exciting and gratifying to finally begin to bring students back to school! You can imagine our profound joy to be together again!

Back in March of 2020, Jubilee began the scary, but innovative journey of distance learning. This past month, in early March, 2022, we marked the beginning of a new phase, hybrid learning, bringing our students, step-by-step, back to the classroom. We started with Middle School in March and, Lord willing, we will be able to open 1st - 6th grades during the month of April. This hybrid system, mandated by the Honduran Secretary of Education, means that, for now, we are allowed 15 students in one classroom at a time. This means that half the class is virtual while simultaneously the other half is inperson, switching every other day.

While speaking with several middle school students, some shared their joys and challenges upon coming back to in-person school. For instance, Emily Martinez (8th grade student who has been at Jubilee since PreK) shared that most of her family are not Christians. She told us that her goals this year are to "get good grades, include God in all of her life, and through His power be able to help others. I want to be a light to others and that through me, many return to Christ."
