As many of you may have heard lately in the news, the migration flow to the US from Honduras, Venezuela and other neighboring countries are at an all-time high. Here in Tegucigalpa, we don't just read about it in the news, we are witnessing the detrimental effects of migration on our daily lives and the lives of those around us. Over half of our students have a parent, grandparent, or close relative who has immigrated to the US or Spain. In fact, sadly, last month, after discouraging their decision, three of our students, three siblings, took the dangerous trek with a paid "coyote" to cross the US border and find their mom, who had migrated to the US over a year ago. Thankfully, their lives were spared and they are now safe with their mother.

Regardless of what you believe politically about the migration situation, Jubilee is addressing the problem at its source by providing high quality Christ-centered education to low-income children and youth in Honduras. Through your support, Jubilee is creating a thriving, vibrant community



of children and youth who are learning, developing, maturing in Christ, and growing hopes and dreams for a better future for themselves and their communities right here in Honduras.

Thank you so much for supporting Jubilee's mission. You are truly impacting lives and making a difference now, for generations to come, and for all eternity!

Construction Update

After being under construction for over four years, construction is finally drawing to a close. As we said in Jubilee's last newsletter, we have added over 30,000 square feet of usable space. However, much more meaningful than the square footage are the new opportunities and experiences these spaces make available for our growing student population. Jubilee added 7th-9th grades in 2020, 10th grade this year in 2023, and will add 11th grade in 2024.

In July, we opened our newly finished roofed sports court which is being used morning, afternoon, and sometimes even in the evenings for our PE classes, recess times, and our after-school sports programs. Students are practicing handball, soccer, and now basketball!

Our chapel is almost completed, with only some interior AV details and acoustics remaining. There is great anticipation

among our students, staff, and parents to inaugurate the new chapel with our yearend musical concert production! The chapel will be used for Jubilee's church services, parent meetings, events, celebrations, musical, dance, and theatrical productions! The chapel will also soon be put to use in the morning, afternoon, and evenings, Sunday-Saturday and will fit up to 500 people!

Despite all the challenges that have stood in the way of this construction project (cost increases, labor shortages, supply delays), we are thrilled to announce that our construction project will be completed soon. Although the total cost rose to over \$1.1 million, thanks to the Lord and generous partners like you, we are debt-free and can now enjoy and fully utilize these important and beautiful new spaces.
