We've also seen God's hand in the health challenges faced by several staff members. Our beloved Office Manager, Gaby, whose appendix ruptured in December, spent over 40 days in the hospital. After a 2nd hospital stay for a colostomy reversal in June, praise the Lord she is back at work and in full health. Mrs. Cindy, our guidance counselor, also underwent unexpected surgery earlier this quarter and has thankfully returned as well. These recoveries are testimonies of God's mercy and healing for the entire Jubilee community.

Despite these trials, the school year has been filled with joy and progress. Our students are preparing for the final district-level championship round of the Science Fair, and we're thrilled to be moving our full school concert—featuring all 400 students—to August this year!

Theater Program:

SETTING THE STAGE FOR THE GOSPEL

The theater program at Jubilee began in 2016—as a small seed of vision and faith. That year, a group of fourth-grade students performed a simple drama during the school concert. Our theater program, birthed in the hearts of our founders, inspired by God, to share the gospel through the arts.

Though it started small, the program steadily grew. In 2023, it became an official extracurricular activity, with rehearsals held every Tuesday and Thursday afternoon. Today, more than 70 students of various ages participate, all using their God-given talents to serve the Lord. The mission is simple and powerful: Formation and discipleship for each student involved. Evangelism and biblical testimony for every person in the audience.

Some students, like 11th graders José, Jeremy, and Nelson, have been part of the program for over six years. Nelson is also now an active member of our church. These students have grown not only in their artistic abilities but also in their love for God and their desire to serve Him.

The program has developed significantly over the years. What began as short plays has expanded to include acting, dance, live music, singing, lighting, and stage design. Every performance is a message from God's heart—carefully crafted to impact the audience and bring glory to His name. Theater at Jubilee has also sparked excitement among our younger students, who now have their own group of young actors. They're learning that theater can be a powerful tool to share Jesus, and they proudly call themselves servants and instruments of the Lord.

“WHAT I AM IS GOOD”: ANGEL’S STORY

Gloria was told that she would never be able to have children, but now, through God’s grace and supernatural power she is a mom of three Angel (18), Javier (16), and Francis (14). Angel was truly a miracle, but at just eighteen months of age, he began having seizures, and no one could explain why.

A few years later, in 2012, after Angel completed his first year of Kindergarten at Jubilee, it became clear that his mother, Gloria was in a very difficult situation. Jubilee offered her a position helping with errands and odd jobs around the school. She accepted, and has continued to serve faithfully ever since, while Angel remained a part of the Jubilee family.

At the time, Angel was in second grade and struggling to keep up with his classmates. That year, a doctor eventually determined that Angel has a severe developmental delay.

While Jubilee does not have a formal program for students with special needs, Jubilee welcomed Angel with open arms. The principal and teachers worked diligently to adapt lessons and assignments to meet Angel’s unique abilities. Gradually, he began to grow. By third grade, Angel had learned to read and write. Angel found belonging within the Jubilee community. He is deeply loved by his classmates and the entire Jubilee staff. Angel is known for saying, with confidence, “What I am is good. I’m good.”

Gloria, continues to serve as a full time janitor. Sadly, Angel and his siblings’ father was never present or supportive, and financial hardship has been a constant struggle for the family. But Gloria remains grateful. “Jubilee is a blessing,” she says. “I can find the Lord in every way, and everyone at Jubilee is a blessing for us.”

Last year, Angel graduated from the 9th grade. After the ceremony, he approached Pastor David and said, “Pastor, I’m ready to work.”



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Since furthering regular high school academic rigor was not a good option for Angel and there are no good "special needs" programs to complete a High School degree, Jubilee decided to offer Angel a meaningful new opportunity: to work as a teacher's aide in the 2nd grade classroom with Mrs. Nancy.

This role has been a gift to Angel—not only providing financial support, but also helping him continue learning. Under Mrs. Nancy's guidance, Angel is growing in confidence and responsibility. He supports the students and serves the school joyfully. All of us at Jubilee have seen him mature in remarkable ways.

One of the clearest signs of that growth came through a deeply personal decision: his desire to be baptized. When Angel heard about the upcoming baptisms, he immediately said, **"I'm in! I love Jesus and want to be baptized."** In the days leading up to it, he was filled with anticipation and prayer. On the day of the baptism, Angel was the first one to step into the water, beaming with joy.

Angel is deeply loved by the Lord and also greatly loved here within the Jubilee community. He also shows us all God's love through his hugs, smiles, and his iconic thumbs up.
